Snow Removal Bid for the 2023/2024 School Session

All Bidders must read and fully complete Bid Form. Partial or incomplete Bid Forms will not be accepted. The contractor certifies that it is qualified to perform all services under the contract in a workmanlike and professional manner. It further certifies that it has sufficient on-site and back-up equipment and manpower available to accomplish an up to 12" snowfall removal. Plowing snow during school hours shall commence after two (2) inches or more, or upon request. All areas to be marked where damage could occur. Snow shall be sufficiently pushed back to allow for additional snow removal. Fire Hydrants and Emergency Exits shall not be blocked. Salting is to be done on an "as needed" basis, for an additional cost. **Plowing of overnight storms shall be completed by 6:30 am. A mandatory informational meeting for the winning bidder for Woodstock High School contract will be held with the WUHS Grounds Manager on November 8, 2023 at 10:00 am at Woodstock Union High School.**

Termination: Either party may terminate this Agreement on fifteen (15) calendar days' written notice, or if prior to such action, the other party materially breaches any of its representations, warranties or obligations under this Agreement. Except as may be otherwise provided in this Agreement, such breach by either party will result in the other party being responsible to reimburse the non-defaulting party for all costs incurred directly as a result of the breach of this Agreement, and shall be subject to such damages as may be allowed by law including all attorneys' fees and costs of enforcing this Agreement.

(For example: if the Bidder's corresponding numbers were; 1-3" = \$500; 3-6" = \$700; 6-9" = \$950; 9-12" = \$1250, the average step would be \$250 and the amount paid for a 14" snowfall would be \$1250 + \$250 = \$1500.)

Insurance Requirements

During the term of this Snow Removal Contract, Contractor shall comply with the insurance provisions set forth below. The insurance specified below shall be maintained by Contractor, at its expense, and certificates thereof shall be presented to Mountain Views Supervisory Union in form and content satisfactory to Mountain Views Supervisory Union prior to the commencement of the Services. The insurance is as follows: a. Worker's Compensation in accordance with the laws of Vermont; b. Employer's liability in an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 each accident; c. Comprehensive general liability on an occurrence form for (i) bodily injury and (ii) property damage with limits of at least \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit each occurrence, including but not limited to comprehensive form, premises – operation, explosion, collapse, underground hazard, products/completed operations hazard (3 year extension beyond completion of the Services), blanket contractual coverage, broad form property damage, independent vendors, personal injury(employee exclusion deleted). d. Comprehensive Automobile Liability, comprehensive form covering owned, hired and non-owned vehicles with limits of at least \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit each occurrence. e. Excess liability (umbrella) insurance with limits of at least \$1,000,000.00. The insurance specified in c through e shall include the following: i. Endorsements adding the following parties as additional insureds: Mountain Views Supervisory Union, and their respective board members and employees, agents and representatives. ii. Thirty (30) days' prior written notice of cancellation to the Mountain Views Supervisory Union.

The Mountain Views Supervisory Union shall have no liability or other obligation for any of the insurance, endorsements or other protection required hereunder, including premiums and other charges. The insurance provisions specified herein shall be applicable to any contractors retained by Contractor, and Contractor shall require that such insurance be maintained by all its contractors. All insurance maintained by Contractor shall provide for a waiver of any right of subrogation of the insurers against the Mountain Views Supervisory Union.
